Deidre Nansen McCloskey (chamada Donald ao nacer; Ann Arbor, Michigan, 1942) é profesora emérita distinguida en economía e en historia, así coma profesora emérita en inglés e comunicación, na University of Illinois en Chicago.

É doutora en economía pola University of Chicago (1970) e posue varios títulos honoríficos coma é o doutorado á excelencia académica (Vrije Universiteit Brussel, 2017) e numerosos honoris causa (Jönköping University, 2012; Copenhagen Business School, 2012; National University of Ireland, 2008; and University of Gothenburg, 2007; entre outros).

Ten feito importantes contribucións nos eidos da historia económica (fundamentalmente de Gran Bretaña), a retórica da economía, metodoloxía económica, ética e economía, así como a economía feminista.
